Math Pathways Parent Portal – Years 7-9

You may be aware that our students are using a program called Maths Pathway in mathematics class.



You are able to track their progress using this program from home.

After they've completed their tests you'll have access to all their results and the activities they've been doing in class.

Your son/daughter will have login details to use, you will need a web address and password from them. Alternatively you can contact their maths teacher or stacy.thomas@bayview.vic.edu.au to have the details emailed to you.

Please do not hesitate to call if you have any concerns or questions1. On a computer or a tablet, open a modern web browser such as Chrome or Safari.

- 2. Use your child's login details to access their account.
- 3. Click on the "Parents" button at the top right of the screen.

Clicking this button will take you to the Parent Portal, where you can see an explanation of the Maths Pathway learning model, as well as other data on your child's progress.

You can also register your email address to receive updates regarding upcoming tests etc.


